



## Charities benefit from UKAEA staff survey

Following a recent staff survey that was issued to employees within the UKAEA group, donations totalling £1,204 were made to selected charities.

UKAEA pledged to donate a pound for every survey form that was completed by its employees from all its sites across the UK. All in all, a total of 1204 forms were received and a cheque for £301 was sent to four different charities chosen by each of UKAEA's sites.
